ASAP urges the NSF to publish its decision on the future of the Arecibo Observatory

The ASAP Board has sent a letter to the NSF's leadership urging them to publicly state their intentions with regard to the Arecibo Observatory, as the current cooperative agreement contract term is due to end in March 2023. The letter – which can be obtained through this <u>link</u> – was sent on May 6, 2022. The NSF has yet to answer. We encourage ASAP members to share this letter with their Congressional representatives, and to ask them to communicate with NSF about this issue.
